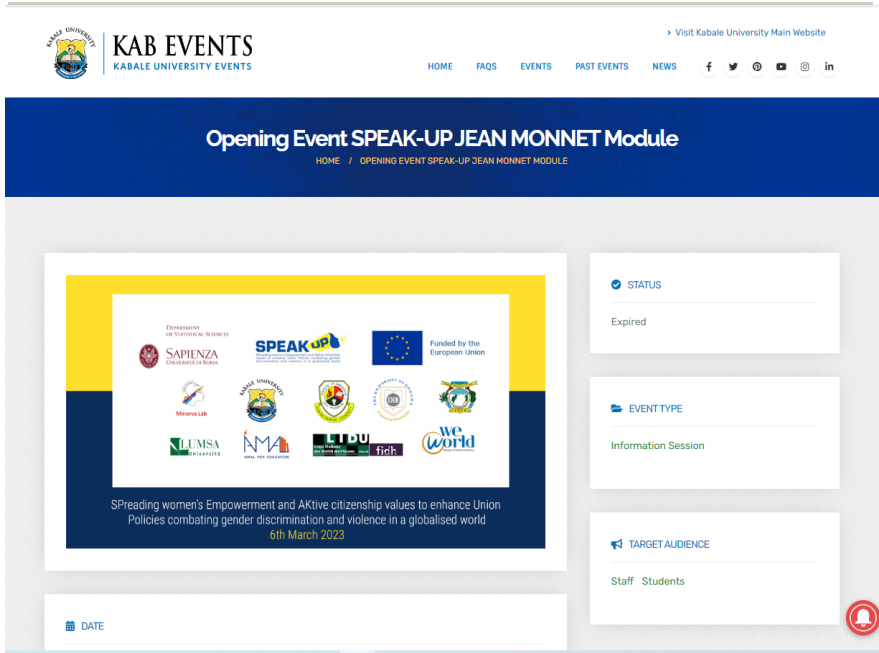

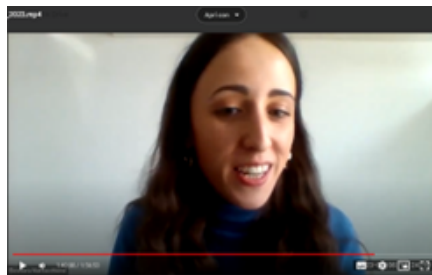

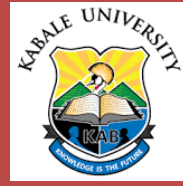
Eleonora Mattacchione , WeWorld Onlus, Advocacy Area - Policy and Research Centre
